












INDIAN ARMY TERMINOLOGY

Terminology often used:-

ALKHALAK:- Longer coat than a Kurta, was replaced almost entirely by 1900 except for Governor Generals/Bodyguards.

KURTA:- Loose type of tunic used by Indian Army Cavalry.

BAHADUR:- Used as a form of address to a brave man or a decorated man.

CUMMERBUND:- Waist sash, with or without hanging tails.


DAFFADAR:- Indian N.C.O. of Cavalry, (Sergeant).

GIRDLE:- Waist belt, usually with 2 stripes.

HAVILDAR:- Indian Infantry N.C.O., (Sergeant).

JEMADAR:- Indian rank, (2nd Lieutenant).

INDIAN ARMY TERMINOLOGY (Cont.)

JODHPURS:- Riding breeches, drawn tight at the knee down to the ankle.

KHAKI:- Dust colour, from the Persian.

KULLA:- Pointed skull cap, under the Lungi.

LUNGI:- Coloured cloth worn around the head.

LANCER WELTS:- Piping up the back and down sleeves of Lancer regimental kurtas and jackets.

MUFTI:- Civilian dress worn by soldiers when off duty.

NAGA:- Trumpeter.

NAIK:- Indian Army rank, (Corporal).

PUGGREE:- Turban, also worn around tropical helmets by officers.

PLASTRON:- Lancer-type of jacket front lapels.

PUTTEES:- Cloth bindings around lower leg.

PYJAMAS:- Cavalry trousers, very baggy.

RISALDAR:- Indian rank, (Captain).

SEPOY:- Indian native soldier of Infantry.

SHABRAQUE:- Ornamental saddle cloth.

SOWAR:- Indian Cavalry Trooper.

SUBEDAR:- Indian Infantry rank, (Captain).

TULWAR:- Curved scimitar.

TIFFIN:- Lunch.

TURBAN:- Cloth wound headdress.



SCOTTISH ARMY TERMINOLOGY

FEATHER BONNET:- See illustration.

KILMARNOCK:- See illustration.

TAM-O-SHANTER: - See illustration.

TOURRIE:- Pom pom on top of hats.

BALMORAL: Looser type of Kilmarnock.

TARGE:- Shield, usually studded, sometimes has a spike in centre.

SPORRAN:- Purse in front of kilt. Usually covered with hair and ornamented withtassles.

BROADSWORD:- Basket-hilted sword, (see illustration).

SGIAN DHU:- Small dagger stuffed into top of hose, (right leg).

SCOTTISH ARMY TERMINOLOGY (Cont.)

DIRK:- Small dagger, now very ornamented, worn on right side of belt, mainly byPipers.



CHANTER:- Pipe at bottom of pipe bag, which Piper plays with both hands.

TARTAN:- Patterned cloth.

PLAID:- Garment made from tartan, almost like a blanket.



KILT:- Skirt-like garment worn by men, and belted around the waist.

HOSE:- Socks worn by Highland soldiers when wearing the kilt.

GLENGARRY

HACKLE:- Feather worn in the side of bonnets.

GAITERS:- Leg coverings worn over hose, usually white and subject in design to Regimental traditions, (Black Watch has squared off bottom front. Gordons have black buttons).

PAINTING TARTANS

The main thing to remember when painting Tartan is not to be overawed by seeming complexity of all the lines, and be put off trying Scottish figures. Within the scope of this short article, we will concentrate on the regular army tartans used by the British Army. A good buy, undoubtedly, are the colour cards published by Thistle Miniatures of Finden Croft, Aberdeen, (see advert.) They do a sheet for kilts, and one for trews.

We will dissect a tartan, and start with Black Watch, as this is the basis for most military tartans.

Firstly, the base colour - in this case dark blue, and quite a sombre shade in reality. Paint overall dark blue. The overstriping is dark green, four repeats fromwaist to hem, then across in dark green to form a pattern of squares. Where the darkgreen lines intersect, a lighter green square should be painted, then outline all green lines with a black line, in 54 mm, about 1 mm wide. This will make neat all the dark/lighter greens. Then a thin black line through the centre of all squares, vertically and horizontally, will complete a simple "Black Watch" tartan kilt.

At this stage, we can continue and do other Regiments using this basic pattern. For example, a fine yellow line through the centre of green areas will give "Gordon". (The officers is different!) Refer to Thistle card. Then scarlet lines in appropriate places and thickness will give "Cameron of Eracht, for the Queens own Highlanders. Seaforths use Mackenzie, as do the H.L.I. This is Black Watch with red and white overstripes. Leslie, (K.O.S.B.) is also red and white overstripes but in different places to Mackenzie. For difficult ones like Royal Stewart, the best way is to discern the base colour, (red). Then the overstripes in layers, using the Thistle guide cards.

Most kilts were quite different at the back, from the front, because of the pleats, and photographs of the item being worn, if available, are a great help.

The diagram of stages, I hope will help, but if in any doubt, you always start again, so don't despain and just like Robert Bruce - try, try again, as only practice makes perfect.

Toys can be very simplified, for instance Black Watch can be dark blue, then small light green squares in the right place with a fine black cross across these green squares. Gordon is dark green with fine yellow overstripes. And so on for the others, with the spacing and colour of the overstripes giving the "effect" of an accurate tartan. That is how "Pastimes" do it.
