Sometimes it is very awkward being British and of a certain age. We are expected to give you a hard sell about how wonderful these models are, but some of us have been conditioned from infancy to be self-effacing. Dashed difficult, whilst the timely arrival of the International Plastic Modeller's Society's magazine containing the above review solved the problem.

The much praised Hornet military subjects are all made to 1:35 scale, and are in white metal, unless otherwise stated. Many of these figurines have separate arms and heads, and interesting variations can be achieved by the use of Hornet resin bases and plastic DMV Dragon, Tamya and the like.

accessory kits. The Wf1 West series of portraiture figures of American frontier characters is in the traditional 1:35 scale. Our becoming modesty prevents us from quoting more reviews, but we could, we could!

The companion series, Wf1, consists mostly of resin figurines with a few in metal too. In Hornet, the series has acquired a reputation for high quality and consistency. Once again, the WW2 subjects are made to 1:35 scale, but the Napoleonic and ACW are to the traditional 1:32 size. Wf1 is a wider ranging series than I am, and includes models aimed at busts as well

Some of the moulds produced by Dartmoor Military Models are now available under the Wf1 label. We hope to expand this line in future issues.

With a few exceptions (if q. Hornet headsets) all the moulds come with a colour photograph of the assembled and painted kit for your guidance. Parts may be made in white metal, etched metal, or resin, in various combinations. As a general rule if you can build plastic kits you should have no difficulty with Hornet and Wf1 products. The same types of modeller's tools can be employed. You'll need superglue or epoxy adhesive instead of plastic cement; and to take the same precautions if using instruments or tools!







Update to the first edition

Well, we sold out of the first edition catalogue. Rather than reig the whole caboodle, we've decided to reprint and bind in a colour insert sheet that will keep the information pretty well up to date until well into 1999. After the first catalogue went to press, it was discovered that the picture of BH17 on page 4 was in fact a mirror image repeat of figurine BH01. For technical reasons this is not easily rectified, so please check out the picture and correction that appears on this page to see BH17 in its full glory!

Please note that the 'DMM' series of models (formerly on page 16) has been dropped from the range by mutual agreement with Dartmoor Military Models, with whom they originated. Limited quantities are still available from us, and will be supplied while stocks last.

Otherwise, not much has changed. We are steadily adding to the Hornet spare heads sets, which continue to have rhapsodic praise piled on them by reviewers and customers (see the text on the reverse side of this bind-in). It is worth mentioning that because human heads vary in size, many of the Hornet heads can be used as accessories with 1:32 (54mm) size figurines. This is particularly true of the bare heads, because hair can be added to bulk out the skull area as needed. There are many more of the resin Wolt series in the pipeline, but I've decided to hold back on the Hornet metal figure series for the time being, because I think that the market for 1:35 scale WW2 figurines has been so oversupplied that customers are growing resistant to more releases.

This catalogue is intended as a practical and handy reference, rather than as a glossy showcase for the models. That way, we can keep the price down and update the information at reasonable intervals, and would-be diorama builders can see at a glance what we have available. Don't let anyone tell you that these models are hard to get hold of. Lay siege to your hobby supplier until he/she stocks them!

Now that we have a bit of extra space available, the Saunders Megacorporation would like to thank and acknowledge the work of the following talented sculptors: Stefano Cannone, Rendall Patton, Tony Williams, Adrian Bay, Ernie Mirfin, Steve Harrison, Alex Williams; and give a heartfelt round of applause for the painters who brought the models to life: Mark Holden, Roy Dixon, Lee Chandler, Ernie Mirfin, Gary Joslin, Joe Payne, Bill Horan. 



New Hornet 1:35 scale headsets due Spring 1999:

With the advent of a useful series of headsets wearing berets, Hornet has decided to depart from the usual cataloguing system. The beret is by now such a widespread item of uniform that to label these new sets by nationality would be misleading. Here is a short (and inexpert) history of this ubiquitous headgear to help you choose the right set!

Beret-like caps have been worn by armed men for several hundred years, for example the Scots bonnet which subsequently evolved among other things into the Tam o' Shanter (**HBH02**), but it was the French who were probably the first to issue a true beret to regular troops. (The Chasseurs Alpine mountain troops wore a beret of heroic proportions from before WW1. It must have kept the snow off the shoulders, and probably served as a sleeping bag in an emergency...)


Between the World Wars both the British and the Germans made the beret a practical and distinctive headgear for their new tank troops, as did the Poles (Hornet figurine **WH04**). The German version was worn over a close fitting round padded helmet, the broad rim of which remained visible (**HGH07**), but it was withdrawn from use in the early stages of WW2. The British armoured troops wore their beret without additional padding, and pulled over the right ear with the badge over the left eye (**HBH01**, **HBH04**). This headgear was adopted and publicised by General Montgomery, (figurine **BH18**) and other senior officers (**BH17**), and was the basic form that is now seen in armed services all over the world in many and various types.

During the War Britain's new Commando and Airborne forces were given the distinctions of green and maroon berets respectively. In the years after the conflict these distinguishing features were imitated by other countries, until they became almost synonymous with elite troops worldwide. In the course of the War, British soldiers abandoned their sidecaps (**HBH02**) and were issued first with the unbecoming GS cap (**HBH02**), and subsequently a true beret similar to the tank crew type.

After WW2 the beret emerged in all shapes and sizes, being pulled and shrunk according to the inclination of the nation, unit and individual wearing it but tending to become smaller as it evolved. Most countries shape the beret in the British fashion, others follow the French tradition and pull to the left. There are anomalies; ex Free French veterans sometimes continued to wear their berets pulled right (**HBH04**) like their British allies of WW2; and US advisors attached to South Vietnamese units wore theirs pulled to the left (**HBH03**), the Vietnamese having inherited the French style.

OK, we gave up. The Hornet 'beret' sets are rationalised into groups and all are unbaged because of the huge variety of insignia around. Examine the sets to discover a shape similar to the one that you are seeking, and model or paint the badge of your choice (but remember that in time of war unit badges may not always be worn for security purposes). As a very broad guide, set **HQH01** has the cocked front generally caused by a stiffener behind the badge, and it could be used to represent a variety of British units postwar, the present day Royal Marines, and US special troops among many others. **HQH02** has the smoother outline produced by a shrink-to-fit exercise and a small badge pinned or sewn to the fabric, and is more typical of some modern British units such as the Guards and Paras. **HQH03** shows typical modern left pull types, and the tiny green beret affected by the French Foreign Legion. Two alternative Legion badges are moulded onto each of the bases because we were feeling kind that day... **HQH04** represents some styles of the 1940s and 50s when conscription was common and the beret considered just another piece of horrible uniform that an army forced on its reluctant soldiers! This is also the set to choose to represent British WW2 troops.

NB: Please remember that all these headsets are the copyright of the sculptor, Roger Saunders, and such copyrights are protected by International Law. Please do not use these models for commercial production or as part of a pattern commissioned by a manufacturer other than Hornet. Hornet products have not been licensed to any other source, and unauthorised reproduction could result in serious consequences for the relevant manufacturer and his stockists.
